evident, with cable, telephone, and computers and in many cases, cell phone signals going dead.

That's why it's important to keep other modes of communication around in case the worst befalls us.

Instituting a Radio Amateur Civil Service is one way some towns are allowing for that to happen.

The RACES groups are generally made up of dedicated volunteers that train to communicate over amateur radio bands.

They serve as a secondary backup for police and other emergency services in case other modes of communication fail.

There's a group in Denville, in Rockaway, and in other municipalities in the area.

Ham radio is still very much alive and well, with over 764,189 operators in the United States. The FCC-allocated frequencies are used by operators divided into three classes: Technician, general and extra.

Each class has a different set of technical know-how.

In order to get a license for any of these classes, an exam is required – and the operator has to learn strict FCC requirements, regulations and a gamut of technical terms.

Ham radio operators lend a helping hand to emergency services operating within the township.

Although they're no longer the primary means of communication over long distances, operators have found a well-needed niche for themselves.

And in cast the worst befalls us, we'll always have radio to back us up.


