ALSO TOMORROW

The Fair Lawn Amateur Radio Club (FLARC) will partner with the National Park Service to provide a special event station at the Paterson Great Falls National Historical Park in Paterson, NJ. The event will be held on Friday, April 13th at the National Park Service location at Mary Ellen Kramer Park -- entrance along Maple Street, Paterson, NJ -- from 9AM until 4PM EDT.

The club's special event call sign, W2E, is to commemorate "Water To Electricity" and the vision behind Alexander Hamilton's transformation of the Passaic River to turn Paterson into the first planned industrial city in America by taming the power of water. Frequencies will center on 14.245 14.045 7.245 and 7.045. Locally, 146.55 will be their working frequency and they would appreciate locals there to speak with the visiting students. They will also monitor the Fair Lawn ARC repeater on 145.470 (-) PL 167.9.

Those who make contact with W2E will receive a commemorative QSL card.

HIGH FT8 QSO RATES IN DXPEDITION MODE

The second public test of the FT8 DXpedition Mode was last Saturday. Three stations K1JT, W1/KH7Z and W7/KH7Z were the "Foxes" and 390 stations showed up as the "Hounds". K1JT logged 55 stations in 21 minutes for a 157 per hour rate. W1/KH7Z logged 61 stations in 36 minutes for a rate of 102 per hour and W7/KH7Z worked 174 stations in 60 minutes for a rate of 174 per hour. Joe Taylor K1JT reported that AA7A the operator at W7/KH7Z got a lot better as his hour progressed. "After a program restart a 1532 UTC, he worked 105 additional stations a rate of 225 per hour during the remaining part of the hour". More stations on the reflector are asking about using FT8 on Field Day but currently there is no set format for making Field Day contacts.
