THIS MONTH IN 1949

There were two meetings in April of 1949. It looks like a lot of the XYL's showed up for the April 7 meeting. Probably to see why their husbands were out late two nights a month. The highlight of that meeting was that the ARRL had reported that the club had never been disaffiliated and would be put back on that active list. Still no information about the club before 1949 but now we know for sure that the Morris Radio Club existed sometime after World War I.

I found the April 20th meeting Treasurers report interesting in that it was only an approximation of what was in the Treasury. Also Ed Weed tried to get Major Edwin Armstrong to be the speaker at the June 2nd meeting but was unsuccessful. It looks like he struck out with the backup speaker Paul Godley too. Godley had worked with Guglielmo Marconi, Lee De Forest, Edwin H. Armstrong and Michael Pupin on wireless and radio improvements. In 1921 the American Radio Relay League sent him to Scotland for trans Atlantic shortwave signal tests, and he successfully received a radio telegram. Godley operated a consulting radio engineering company bearing his name in Upper Montclair from 1926 until his retirement in 1963.

OLD CALLS NEVER DIE

My daughter N2ZRS forwarded a Facebook post from Nancy Polen W2WCF. Some of you may remember her father Ray who was very active in Parsippany RACES. Nancy took her fathers call after he passed away. My dad always shared his love for technology with me.

I was daddy's little girl.

I followed him everywhere.

He taught me to sail, and I was his crew. He was an amateur magician and I was his lovely assistant. He was in his high school marching band, so I was too. He taught me the value in having a variety of hobbies and in sharing those hobbies in community. I learned from him that every single person we meet has something to teach us.

He was an avid ham radio/short wave/amateur radio operator radio... so... I studied up and got my license too (1989). I grew up listening to him use his short wave radio to talk to people in REALLY cool and faraway places. Together we did lots of amateur radio community service events together. He let me talk on the radio under his supervision before I got my license. (When I was just a little girl, I vividly recall us talking to scientists in Antarctica and they described the penguins walking by!.. how cool is that!?! Maybe that contributed to me becoming a serious birder.. who knows?)

Shortly after he passed away in 2002, I acquired his call sign (W2WCF). Tears streamed down my face when I received the paperwork confirming the official transfer of his call to me in the mail. I've had all his equipment boxed up in my basement ever since then.. and haven't had it in me to touch it for over 17 years.

Well...this week all that changed.

I dusted off the boxes.. played around and connected some power supplies, wires, and radios... and tad-DAH! I'm back on the air after not being active for 23 years. .. (No smoke, no fire so far.. so I think we're good lol!)

And not only am I back on the air.. BUT I used his call sign as mine for the VERY first time since he passed away.



Meeting of April 7, 1949

The meeting was called to order at 8:15 PM at Red Cross Headquarters in Morristown

John McCann (W2AFB) presided

Attendance 17 amateurs 8 XYL's Total 25

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and accepted.

The Technical Director Art Lince (W2DAE) announced that Bayman McWhan (W2GAX) had accepted the appointment as Assistant Technical Director

Guernsey Day (W2OYH) reported on the results of a test of his transmitter at McWhan's house - He reported satisfactory progress - No Interference.

The roll was called and visiting XYL's were introduced.

The President welcomed the guests and spoke briefly on the nature and purpose of the club.

The communication Director - Pent Sumner (K2BI) spoke on the history of emergency activities in Morris Plains and Morristown. He urged the membership to stop procrastinating and get their mobile and emergency units under weigh. He mentioned that a drill will be held sometime after June 1 and that new apparatus should be working at that time.

The secretary read a letter from the ARRL stating the club had never been disaffiliated and completion of forms would put us on the active mailing list.

A letter from W2IOP - Editor of CQ was also read stating that he would mention the reforming of the Morris Radio Club and that CQ could be had at club rates for 30 or more people at \$2.50/annum. No reduction for other periodicals.

Bill Lynch presented three army release films

The door prize (a 0-1 Ma Movement Simpson Meter) was won by Bayman McWhan (W2GAX)

The meeting was adjourned at 9:50 PM for refreshments

After some difficulty in obtaining access to the meeting room the meeting was called to order at 8:23 PM by Tom McCann W2AFB

The roll was called

Pent Sumner K2AB Communications Manager emphasized the need for getting going on emergency equipment. Of 11 persons interested in 2 meter mobile equipment only 4 have anything to show. It is recommended that a next meeting all interested persons have some progress to report on their emergency equipment.

Art Lince – Technical Director brought up the possibility of obtaining some field strength measuring equipment either by purchase or borrow for the club. The membership was asked whether it was interested. In general the idea was approved informally. Mr. Lince said he would continue to work on it.

The Treasurer reported a balance of approximately \$39.00 in the Treasury.

The Pr4sident brought up the matter of a constitution and/or rules of operation for the club. It was suggested that the ARRL might have a copy the old Morris Radio Club Constitution and/or by laws and the secretary was instructed to write for such a copy.

The President announced the results of FCC Measurement of Guernsey Day's transmitter. This transmitter was built by W2OYH as an anti TVI transmitter and with fundamental output of 140,800 uV had second harmonics 18.55 uV 77.5 dB down 300 feet from the transmitter. WCBS TV was measured at 150 uV at the same point. This indicates that the job can be done but that it is more difficult since the television signals are so weak. 500 uV is standard service area difficulty.

The President made some general remarks on this and publicity of the event as a club effort was discussed.

The secretary noted that a report of the totals by Tom Schrein W2ENV had been received and copies had been sent to both Morristown and Madison Red Cross units.

Ed Weed announced that he was unable to get Major Armstrong for the June 2 meeting but that he was working on Paul Godley for that meeting.

At 9:40 the business meeting adjourned and Tom Winternitz W2YTH gave a discussion and demonstration of speech clipping and filtering as applied to amateur transmitters


