

I wasn't able to work him. UPDATE: Things picked up later in the day and I ended up working 16 stations on Saturday and another 4 on Sunday when the band opened up to Florida for a half hour. I worked our old friend NA2U who was in Phoenix but running a KW using a Force 12 C19XR antenna from a remote station in Safford, AZ. He was only on the air Saturday but worked 243 stations.
