A HISTORY OF THE WANJ AWARD

As most of you know next month is the 70th anniversary of the reactivation of the Morris Radio Club so it came as quite a surprise when around December 1st Noel received a membership application from W3HDH in Seymour IL. At the bottom Doug had written that he was a member from 1953 to 1965 when he was K2GLQ and was one of the founders of the NANJ award. Noel recognized the call immediately as the holder of the NANJ certificate #1. The call was also familiar to Noel because before he moved to Morris County he was active and held offices in the Nutley Amateur Radio society which has held the call W2GLQ for many years. Noel asked Doug if he could supply us with a history of the award and here is Doug's reply:

HI Noel

Thanks for the note. It has been awhile since I was a member (1953-1960) while in Morristown High School, U of Delaware, Carnegie Mellon although attendance during college was minimal - usually just field day.

Yes, I remember operating portable on field day while teaching at Middlebury College in Vermont and constantly getting "Worked before" obviously from W2GLQ.

WANJ started as kind of an informal contest among radio club members. At the time, I was one of the net control stations for the NJ Phone and Traffic net and mentioned that we sometimes almost had all counties check into the net. Someone said their should be an award. So Ed W2IDZ and I were chatting on six meters one night and decided to go ahead. We were overheard by several other stations and the race was on. I got to Ed first with my 21 cards. Surprised that it is still offered and thanks for keeping it going.

Speaking of field day, my very first FD was with the Morris Radio Club. At the time, meetings were held at the Morristown Armory on Western Ave. The National Guard offered their building for us to use on FD. It was a great setup as we had tables, chairs, lots of space to setup in dif-
