COWW CONTEST SCORES

The raw scores for the CQ Worldwide CW and SSB contests have been posted. Bill WA2VQF operating Single-Op Low Power All Bands in the CW Contest came in 588 of 1484 in the world, 131 of 365 in the Continent and 113 of 317 in the Country. Craig WR2G operating Assisted High Power All bands came in 442 of 1337 in the world, 213 of 594 in the continent and 197 of 557 in the Country. In the SSB Contest, Craig running in the same category came in 131 of 1177 in the world, 54 of 557 in the Continent and 197 of 557 in the Country.

Our friend and former member Fred NA2U was again part of the PJ2T nine man operation from Curacao running Multi-OP Multi-Transmitter in the CW contest. They came in 3 of 34 in the world, 1 of 1 on the Continent and 1 of 1 in the Country. For the SSB contest he went to Hawaii running alone Assisted High Power All Bands at KH7M. He came in 18th of 1177 in the World, 2nd of 23 in the continent and 2nd of 3 in the Country. For those of you who don't remember Fred before he retired to Phoenix, his personalized NJ license plates were "CW MAN". So it begs the same question. What was CW MAN doing operating in a Phone contest? If any of you worked either contest and submitted a log let me know and I'll post your score.


