FIELD DAY 2011

Well Field Day 2011 has come and gone. We enjoyed dry weather (except for the automatic sprinklers), moderate temperatures, and good fellowship. The trailer that Harvey and Rob supplied was perfect for two stations and the refrigerator and stove came in handy. All of us even got a little sleep. Noel was there early and already had the beam assembled and blocking parking spaces when I arrived. Rob showed up a short time later with the trailer and generator. Harvey and a crew went to work getting the lines up in the lights for the Windom and G5RV. When the Township worked on the field they put up new light poles. These don't have the exposed bolts on the bottom where we used to tie off the ropes so we had to use what we could find. An old I beam, a fence even the control box for the lights worked to secure the ropes. They had just put down new sod on the field a day or two before but the sidelines getting to the field were a sea of mud. We also had to dodge the automatic sprinklers that kept coming on in various areas of the field. Except for the coax pulling out of the connector on the 2 meter antenna on the mast, the beam went up without a hitch not counting the rotor box not indicating. All the antennas had great SWR and we were ready to go. How did we do? Well it's hard to make a direct comparison because this year we ran two stations

but the phone station made 83 contacts more than last year and the CW station had 252 more. Where will this put us in the standings? If we plug this years numbers into last years Class 2A results we would be at the 25th percentile nationwide, Number 2 in NNJ and Number 3 in the Hudson Division. We'll have to wait until December to find out for sure. One thing is certain though. It's mighty impressive for a small group of hams just out for a fun weekend.

Every Field Day we come away with some "Lessons Learned". This year we learned two things. Number 1: If Rob has a wireless gateway setup

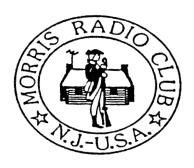
