FIELD DAY WRAP UP

Well another Field Day is in the books. It didn't rain and the hot weather waited a few days to show up. Except for a few problems before the start, everything went fairly smooth. I thought that we were going to have to get the crew started on getting the ropes over the lights on Friday night next year until they found out that Paul KC2ITU had the magic touch. I haven't had time to find out why the CI-V interface was blowing the fuse in the 756 but it will be fixed by next year. Although we only had 5 more "Q's" than last year the spread was different so we had 86 more points than last year along with 100 more bonus points for a total claimed score increase of 6 % over last year. The chart below is a breakdown of the contacts by band for the CW and Phone stations and does not include RTTY. The 2012 total was 693 contacts (Log I) and the 2013 total was 698 (Log 2).
