FIELD DAY WRAP UP

Well Field Day 2016 is in the books and after Noel figured out what was preventing the computers from networking everything went fine. We used the Hanover Township OEM Communications Van that had plenty of room and nice operating positions along with its own generator (take your pick from five of them) along with Noel's new trailer with the ladder mounted to act as a mast for the beam. Noel also modified the tri-bander to also work on 6, 2, and 440. The new slingshot crew got the windoms up with only 10 shots, which might be a new record. 10 Meters was dead on Saturday and we only got 11 CW and one Phone Q's on Sunday. It looks like a lot of stations didn't even try 10. Fifteen was only a little better and all the bands were pretty dead overnight. Even though we had 56 less total Q's than last year our score is 4% higher because of the two new Bonus points, Safety Officer and Social Media. The CW station had 416 Q's an increase of 3 over last year. There were 37 Digital contacts up by 27 from 8 last year and 184 Phone contacts, down by 88 from the 272 worked last year.

Our submission has been received and logged in by the ARRL and you should have received a copy. Currently only Splitrock has submitted a report along with us from Morris County. They were working class 3AC which means they were using commercial power mains. The others have 12 days left to file their reports. The results will be published in the December issue of QST.

Our log was also uploaded to LoTW and we currently have 105 confirmed contacts.

I can't close without again thanking Ed and LeeAnn for the tasty Tube Steaks they prepared for dinner on Saturday night.
