FIELD DAY WRAP UP

Well another Field Day is in the books. Even though we had a last minute location change back to Central Park everything worked out. Noel getting the computers to talk to each other earlier in the week paid off and everything was fine tuned at the setup. We used the Hanover Township OEM Communications Van and generator again this year parked up on the grass which allowed for shorter feed line runs to the windoms. We also used Noel's ladder raised to act as a mast for the beam. The winch problem that prevented it from being raised at Field Day last year was repaired and worked fine. We also again used Noel's modified tri-bander to also work on 6. We used Mark's pneumatic tennis ball launcher that easily got the lines up for the windoms as soon as we found someone who could aim it. 10 Meters was dead on Saturday but, we got 27 CW, and 12 Phone Q's on Sunday. It looks like a lot of stations didn't even try 10. Fifteen was only a little better and all the bands were pretty dead overnight. We had 19 fewer total Q's than last year and as a result our score is 244 points less. The CW station had 409 Q's a decrease of 60 over last year. There were 54 Digital contacts down by 40 from 94 last year and 218 Phone contacts, up by 81 from the 137 worked last year. The Digital count includes the five FT8 contacts, one of which has already been confirmed on LOTW.

Our submission has been received and logged in by the ARRL and you should have received a copy. Currently the only other NNJ class 2A station that has submitted a report along with us is New Providence. New Providence also ran a GOTA station so that will increase their score. The results will be published in the December issue of QST. Our log was also uploaded to LoTW and we currently have 123 confirmed contacts.

There was no June meeting because of the end of school schedule.






