# NO JUNE MEETING

Because the Morris School District has taken unused snow days off the end of the school year, the school will be closed on June 20th and we will not be able to hold a June meeting. See you at Field Day.

### FIELD DAY IS ALMOST HERE

We have the Brickyard Field and Fire permits, so bring on Field Day. Again this year we will be running two stations in the Morris Township OEM Trailer. Phone/Digital and CW. Both stations will have the computers linked so that the logging software will show the operators the mode and operating frequency of both stations. Noel has a new trailer that will support the ladder that is being used as a mast for the Beam. A work detail on June 7th mounted the ladder to the trailer to provide easy assembly on Saturday morning. If you can, please come out to help raise the beam, it will take at least six people to get it up. The Phone/Digital station will use the Beam for 10/15/20 and a Carolina Windom for 40 and 80. The CW station will use a Carolina Windom for all bands. We will again be using Harvey's Arbor Slingshot to get the lines for the wire antennas over the light stanchions on the football field.

Remember although we get points for each contact we make and bonus points for Emergency Power and other items Field Day is technically not a contest. It is an emergency drill. There are no prizes awarded. We just get to see how we compare with other groups in the division and around the

country. There are groups that go all out to be number one nation wide in their class. That's fine but we go just to have a good time and we always end up in the top quarter of the country.

Again this year everyone will be responsible for their own food and drinks but please remember this is a public park and no alcoholic drinks are allowed. Ed will be bringing his ice chest. We have the Fire permit so if anyone wants to bring a grill to cook, be our guest. Sometimes it gets hot on Field Day so Sunblock, water, a hat and a chair are always good things to have. Field Days can also be rainy so it may pay to pack some wet weather gear just in case.

If you have a favorite pair of headphones bring them along. Both the ICOM and Kenwood take a 1/4" phone jack for the headphones. We will have adapters for other sizes.

We will again be set up at Brickyard Field at Bee Meadow Park in the Whippany section of Hanover Township. If you have GPS the coordinates are 40.835438, -74.410889. Those
