FIELD DAY LOCATION CHANGE

Because of a conflict in scheduling with Hanover we have to move our Field Day Site to Central Park. Again this year we will be running two stations in the Hanover Township OEM Trailer. Phone/Digital and CW. Both stations will have the computers linked so that the logging software will show the operators the mode and operating frequency of both stations. Noel this year will be using a telescoping mast for the Beam. If you can, please come out to help raise the beam, it will take at least six people to get it up. The Phone/Digital station will use the Beam for 10/15/20 and a Carolina Windom for 40 and 80. The CW station will use a Carolina Windom for all bands. We will be using Marks' launcher with Harvey's Arbor Slingshot as a backup to get the lines for the wire antennas over the light poles at the ice rink.

Remember although we get points for each contact we make and bonus points for Emergency Power and other items Field Day is technically not a contest. It is an emergency drill. There are no prizes awarded. We just get to see how we compare with other groups in the division and around the country.

There are groups that go all out to be number one nation wide in their class. That's fine but we go just to have a good time and we always end up in the top quarter of the country.

Again this year everyone will be responsible for their own food and drinks but please remember this is a public park and no alcoholic drinks are allowed. Ed will be bringing his ice chest. We have the Fire permit so if anyone wants to bring a grill to cook, be our guest. Sometimes it gets hot on Field Day so Sunblock, water, a hat and a chair are always good things to have. Like in some years past Field Days can also be rainy so it may pay to pack some wet weather gear just in case.

If you have a favorite pair of headphones bring them along. Both the ICOM and Kenwood take a ¼" phone jack for the headphones. We will have adapters for other sizes.



If you are coming by Route 287 get off at Exit 39 (Northbound go towards Whippany) or 39A (Southbound) onto Route 10 East. Go to the first light (Quick Check on the corner) and turn right onto South Jefferson Road. Go to the First light at Eden Lane and turn left. The parking lot entrance and the park are on your right. If you have trouble someone will be monitoring the Morris County OEM Repeater 146.895.
