FIELD DAY 2019

Our Field Day Site again this year will be at Central Park in Hanover. We will be running two stations in the Hanover Township OEM Trailer. Phone/Digital and CW. Both stations will have the computers linked so that the logging software will show the operators the mode and operating frequency of both stations. If you can, please come out to help raise the beam, it will take at least six people to get it up. The Phone/Digital station will use the Beam for 10/15/20 and a Carolina Windom for 40 and 80. The CW station will use a Carolina Windom for all bands. We will be using Marks' launcher to get the lines for the wire antennas over the light poles at the ice rink.

Remember although we get points for each contact we make and bonus points for Emergency Power and other items Field Day is technically not a contest. It is an emergency drill. There are no prizes awarded. We just get to see how we compare with other groups in the division and around the country. There are groups that go all out to be number one nation wide in their class. That's fine but we go just to have a good time and we always

end up in the top quarter of the country.

Again this year everyone will be responsible for their own food and drinks but please remember this is a public park and no alcoholic drinks are allowed. Ed will be bringing his ice chest. We have the Fire permit so if anyone wants to bring a grill to cook, be our guest. Sometimes it gets hot on Field Day so Sunblock, water, a hat and a chair are always good things to have. Like in some years past Field Days can also be rainy so it may pay to pack some wet weather gear just in case.

If you have a favorite pair of headphones bring them along. The ICOM takes a ¼" phone jack for the headphones and Noel has an adapter box for the Flex. We will have adapters for other sizes.

We will be set up at Central Park in Hanover Township. If you have GPS the coordinates are 40.820163, -74.438324 (these coordinates also work with Google

1886 T. A. McCann Honored

One of the few Laboratories men to be decorated by the British Government is T. A. McCann, of Maintenance Facilities. Early commissioned from the Laboratories, Mr. McCann eventually became Colonel and chief of the Signal Information Section, SHAEF, where he was responsible for intelligence on military and civil communications in enemy-held territory in anticipation of the European invasion. While abroad he was awarded the Order of the British Empire, and now has received the warrant of an officer's rank in that order.


