LETS GO DIGITAL

This month let's look at free software to do the digital modes. By digital modes we mean RTTY (Radioteletype) and all the variations of BPSK (Binary Phase Shift Keying) like PSK31. In the case of all of this software we let the computers sound card do all of the work. In fact to get started and just listen to what's going on all you need is a cable from your rigs speaker output to the line input (or MIC input) of your sound card. Then using the computer volume control panel adjust the input level for proper reception.

HAMSCOPE:

Hamscope is an older program that may not work fully with Windows XP and has not been tested with newer operating sys-

tems. It uses what are called Engines (Complied code that this program can access) of other programs (The MMTTY Engine for RTTY). It can be found at http://www.qsl.net/hamscope

MULTIPSK:

MultiPSK written by F6CTE supports BPSK, MPSK, Packet, Pactor I, AMTOR, Olivia, Hellschreiber, RTTY and SSTV. It is available at http:// f6cte.free.fr/ index_anglais.htm.

MMTTY AND MMVARI:

Both MMTTY and MMVARI are written by JE3HHT Makoto Mori. MMTTY is a RTTY only program whereas MMVARI which is listed as an experimental program supports

RTTY, BPSK, GMSK, MFSK and QPSK. NIMM Logger which used to have MMTTY as its standard digital program with MMVARI as an alternate selection now comes with MMVARI as the digital program. This is the digital interface that we will be using on Field Day. Both are available at http://hamsoft.ca/

WIN WARBLER:

Win Warbler supports PSK31, PSK63, PSK125 and RTTY. It uses the MMTTY Engine for RTTY. It can simultaneously decode PSK transmissions on three separate frequencies and can simultaneously monitor and decode up to 47 PSK transmissions across the band, extracting callsigns and cap-


