FIELD DAY WILL NOT BETHE SAMETHIS YEAR

There are a lot of questions going around about Field Day this year and the quick answer is we don't know what is going to happen. We don't know if the park will be open for our operation and we don't know how many members will be allowed on site or in the trailer. So far the ARRL has been no help. They announced that there were not going to be any changes to the rules. Most of the major contests have a club score where the club score is the total aggregate score from logs submitted by members. The ARRL says that they will not be allowing that. On April 22nd they came out with "Instead of participating in a group event this year, consider operating as a Class B, C, D, or E station, utilizing your own call sign. ARRL will include club names for all participating stations in the published results," The problem I see with this is that the entry form states that the club name is for class A or F only.

CQ WORLDWIDE RESULTS

Club members took part in the CQ Worldwide Contests last fall and the results are out. In the SSB contest Craig WR2G who worked Single Operator Assisted High Power All Band placed 10th in the 2nd Call District, 56th in the country and 132 in the world. Joe N1MID worked Single Operator Unassisted Low Power 40 Meters only and came in 3rd in the Second Call District, 12th in the country and 150th in the world. In the CW Contest Craig WR2G again working Single Operator Assisted High Power All Band came in 26th in the Second Call District, 205th in the country and 429th in the world. Bill WA2VQF worked Single Operator Unassisted Low Power All Band and scored 10th in the Second Call District, 113th in the country and 529th in the world. Congratulations to all.
