BRUSH UP YOUR CONTESTING SKILLS

It's fall and Contest Season has started. For those of you that are new to contesting Randy Thompson K5ZD has a YouTube video called "Tips for Being a Better Single Op Contester". It is available at

It runs about 40 minutes and has some good tips for someone that is fairly new to contesting. I have found that for a modest station, accuracy is the biggest contributor to a better score. I know that I will never be one of the leaders so I try to have no errors on the Log Checking Report. Concededly as I am writing this the Log Checking Report for the CQ CW WPX Contest showed up in my email inbox. Unfortunately I busted three calls and four exchanges and that cost me 720 points. The best one was NN4GG. I dropped the first "N" from his call but he busted my exchange so we both lost on that one. I'll try to do better in the CQ WW CW Contest in November. I've had perfect results in that one before.

2020 CQ WPX CW RESULTS

The results of the 2020 CQ WPX CW Contest have been posted and Craig WR2G in the Single Assisted High Power All Band division came in 9th in the 2nd call area, 118th in North America and 318th in the world. Bill WA2VQF operated Single Operator Low Power All Band and scored 22nd in the 2nd call area, 368th in North America and 1120th in the world.


