THE SPOTS ARE BACK

After 48 days out of 50 with no sunspots on November 9th the spots came back and stayed until January 2nd with only two spotless days in that stretch. We even hit a high of 84 on November 29th. The Solar Flux peaked the next day at 116. Luckily this coincided with the CQ World Wide CW Contest. Although things have gone quiet with no sunspots for the last eleven days, hopefully this is a good sign of things to come.

CW AIN'T DEAD

The CQ World Wide CW Contest was held on November 28th and 29th 2020. The Sunspot number was 86 and the Solar Flux was well over 100 so things were looking good.. When I got on in the middle of Saturday morning 15 Meters was hopping. Belgium, Serbia, Italy and Finland went into the log one after another all on the first call. It wasn't until I had put around 50 Q's in the log that I realized that I was only running 50 watts output power. It wasn't until Monday morning that I submitted my entry and uploaded the log to LOTW. I kept checking to see if my LOTW entry had been processed. It's usually fairly quick but, not this time. A couple of hours later I checked the LOTW Queue and found out that because of the volume it was going to take around 10 hours to get to my log. Just before our Monday night get-together I checked and it had been processed. I think it took around eleven hours. Periodically checking the LOTW Queue status I was amazed at the volume of logs to be processed. The largest numbers that I saw were 19,321 logs in the Queue containing 1.8 Million QSO's with a processing time of 13 hours. I did approximately the same as last year. I worked 2 countries on 80, 9 countries on 40, 32 on 20, 36 on 15 and 5 on 10. I heard at least five more on 10 that I couldn't work including OA4SS in Chile. It always amazes me how that piece of wire less than 35 feet off the ground and bent into various shapes to fit on my lot works the world. Unfortunately Craig WR2G suffered a computer crash which prevented him from taking part in the full contest. He was looking forward to setting a new personal record.


