Opening of Meeting
President Ed opened the meeting at 8:02 PM

Reports:

Secretary – Bill WA2VQF reported that January minutes were issued in the February 2021 Peaks and Nulls Newsletter. Sid reported that Jim's call was busted in the attendees. It was reported as K2YD instead of KY2D

Craig WR2G moved to accept the Secretary report. Rob KC2RDX seconded. The report was accepted.

Treasurer – Noel NO2EL reported that the February account balances, The actual numbers are available from Noel.

Noel reported that he emailed dues invoices, collected dues, redid the membership application on the web site to correct a problem with browser combability and filed IRS for 990-N.

Joe N1MID moved that the Treasurers report be accepted. Rob KC2RDX Seconded. The Treasurers report was accepted.

Old Business

There was no old business.

New Business:

Joe N1MID asked if the club was interested in selling the equipment that was donated over a year ago and are currently in storage. It was also discussed about loaning the equipment to members to get on the low bands.

Craig moved that it be looked into. It was passed by unimatious hand vote. How to loan the equipment out will researched by Noel and Craig and will be voted on later.

Noel moved that Henry K2DEU under Article I Section 5 of the MRC Constitution be voted a Life Time Membership. It was passed 14 to 0

An Open Letter to Members of the Morris Radio Club from Noel, NO2EL

When Covid hit I guess we all hoped that the disruption to our in-person meetings would be a short one and we would be back to normal within a year or so. Thankfully with the help of my son Gary, N2UDZ, we were able to get our monthly meetings up and running virtually as well as weekly virtual get-togethers to check on the well-being of our members. We used his 3cx phone system account which came with a video chat/meeting product called 3cx Web Meeting. Some of our members discovered that the apps for smartphones and tablets were lacking the chat feature which was available to computer users. Harvey, WS2Q, stepped up and is currently hosting the meetings using his Zoom account which seems to have solved that problem. Our thanks go out to both Gary and Harvey.

As we move forward, it has become evident to the Club's Executive Staff (Officers) that the Club will be all virtual for a much longer time than we hoped. In my opinion I don't believe that we will be able to get back into our meeting room at the Normandy Park School before September and, even then, there might be COVID-19 testing required and some form of virtual get-togethers will continue after that.

Because of that and because the Officers firmly believe that a service which is so important to the operation of the Club should be in the control of the Club, I was asked to see what products were available to us. I investigated three products (in alphabetical order), Google Meet, Microsoft Teams, and Zoom. It turned out that Google Meet and Microsoft Teams are both part of a packaged software product (Suite). Meet is a part of Google Workspace and Teams is a part of Office 365. All three offer versions for non-profit organizations at discounted prices. Both Google and Microsoft offer free versions while Zoom's lowest price is \$75 per year.

Looking deeper into the three products, I found that Zoom was only a video conferencing product while both Google and Microsoft included additional services that could benefit our club including a Club calendar and shared cloud storage. Both Google and Microsoft are popular with Meet being used in education and Teams being used in business. There was one feature that separated Google from Microsoft. Google offered individual managed emails for each member using our URL (i.e. callsign@morrisradioclub.org). It was time to give Google a try.

It took me a while to learn the Administration Console but I was able to get the Officers setup and operating. The officers broke away from the "Drop-In" session on March 1st to test Google Meet as our video platform. Of course, it's different than 3CX and Zoom but it does everything and, in fact, it has one additional feature (closed captioning) which works surprisingly well. Everybody has the ability to present and has full control of their camera and microphone. All features are available in the Meet app for both Android and IOS including the ability to switch from front to rear camera. You do not need to have an @morrisradioclub.org email account to participate in a Google Meet meeting but you do need an account to have access to the shared cloud drive. I believe everyone will be able to see our calendar if we make it public but you would need an account to make any changes. About the only issue we've been able to identify is that all attendees in a video meeting appear to have full control of the meeting and we're not sure if that can be changed. We're investigating that issue.

That's about it. Mark, W2GM, our vice-president has come onboard as a 2nd Administrator and has been a great help. We are currently planning to host our March Monthly Meeting on March 15th using this platform. So, if you're planning to use a smartphone or tablet, go to your app store and download the Google Meet app. For anyone who might be interested, the platform can be found by searching Google Workspace for Non-Profits or G-Suite for Non-Profits (Google is in the middle of re-branding). 
