On page 84 of the December 2021 issue of QST (yes it finally came) is the ARRL VEC Volunteer Examiner Honor Roll. They recognize the top 10 VEC's in each division. In the Hudson Division our own Sid K2GG

is number five. Sid has done 405 sessions since he was accredited in 1994. If you've never been to one of Sid's sessions you're missing a real experience. Congratulations to Sid and Thank You.

CQWW RAW SCORES

The raw scores for the CW World Wide CW Contest in November have been posted. It looks like only two of our members took part. Craig WR2G operated Assisted High Power All Bands with a raw score of 1,216,775 points. That put him 283 of 1528 in the world, 119

of 697 in North America and 110 of 653 in the US..

Bill WA2VQF operated Single-Op Low Power All Bands and has a raw score of 28,952. He is 949 of 1641 in the world, 225 of 423 in North America and 181 of 353 in the US.

SSTV A BUST

If you remember there were going to be additional SSTV transmissions from the International Space Station on December 1st and 2nd. They were again to be transmitted from the Russian Module. I haven't had success from that module in the past and this was no exception. I was able to get the following picture from a pass on December 1st that only had an elevation 19 degrees. The next pass was at 51 degrees but they were not transmitting. This same thing happened the last time they used the Russian Module. They didn't follow the printed time schedule.


