A BIG MONTH IN SATELLITES

November was a bonus month for those who are active with the Amateur Satellites. There were 40 satellites launched that carried Amateur Radio payloads. On November 19 and 20 four CubeSats were launched from the International Space Station using a CubeSat Cannon that shot them into space. Also on November 20th there was the Minotaur launch that some of us observed launching 12 CubeSats. Then the next day on the 21st there was a Yansy Dnepar launch in Russia that put 24 CubeSats in orbit including the first satellites for the countries of Pakistan and Peru. Most of these CubeSats are only transmitting beacons and sending telemetry but, there are some that are carrying SSB/CW transponders (435 Up 2 Meters Down). An Example is FUNcube-I which has been given the AMSAT designation of AO-73. It has had its transponder turned on after initial testing of the Satellite. In fact the current AMSAT TLE list of 2 Line Keplerian Elements shows 82 active Amateur Satellites. The only operating FM Satellite is SO-50(SaudiSat I-C). It is operating in mode I with a uplink frequency of 145.800 67.0 Hz PL and a downlink of 436.800. It has a ten minute timer that has to be armed with a 2 second carrier with a PL tone of 74.4 Hz. There are also four Transponder Satellites available for use. AO-7 was Launched November 15, 1974 and became non-operational in 1982 due to battery failure but in 2002 the battery un-shorted so now the spacecraft is operational only when illuminated, FO-29 (IAS-2) has a transponder operating in mode V/U (2 Meters up 435 Down), VO-52 (Hamsat) is operating in mode U/V (435 Up 2 Meters Down) and AO-73 (FUNcube-I) also operating mode U/V. Currently there are no low band (10/15 Meters) satellites left in an operational state. Most of these CubeSats have been constructed by schools and colleges and Amateur Radio is the most cost effective way to communicate with them.
